

INTERNATIONAL MISSIONS

Gold Creek's reach extends all over the world. From the Philippines to Africa to campuses in Puerta Vallarta, Mexico, we support missionaries as well as a network of pastors to help share the love of Jesus and the Gospel with many wonderful communities and families abroad.

In the Philippines, Jordan and Shaira Haarberg minister to adults, youth and children throughout the town of Talibon on the island of Bohol. They're able to have some amazing conversations about Jesus that happen around a cup of coffee as they interact with the community at their café (GC Coffee Co.), which they opened for this very purpose.

Emma Larkin and her family attend Gold Creek Woodinville. A few years ago, Emma followed her calling and moved to Senegal, Africa away from her family here in Washington. Emma is doing ministry weekly with a homeless population of children in the area. She works to share the message of Jesus with them and aims to provide a way off the streets to halfway housing. She has also adopted two Senegalese daughters there who were in need of a home.

LOCAL MISSIONS

Our sister organization, Hope Creek Charitable Foundation, meets the physical needs of our local community through programs like the Mill Creek Community Food Bank and Backpacks of Hope, both of which support families with food insecurities. Gold Creek has also partnered with the Pregnancy Resource Clinic to provide factual, life-affirming information to those experiencing an unplanned pregnancy in a safe, confidential, nonjudgmental environment.

CRISIS AND DISASTER RESPONSE

Gold Creek partners with Convoy of Hope to respond with love and compassion when people go through trying and difficult times due to natural and humanitarian disasters. Gold Creek has been able to help provide resources and meet needs on the ground in Eastern Europe, Turkey and Syria.



COMMUNITY

Gold Creek provides community through adult and kids' connect groups and classes, hosting Creek Nights in the summer and men's and women's events throughout the year. Community is in our name and one of the top priorities at Gold Creek Community Church.

People all throughout our community are hurting. It's a privilege to offer a variety of programs at Gold Creek to help meet people's needs, like our Recovery Ministry for those with addictions, GriefShare for people who have lost a loved one and DivorceCare for men and women who are navigating divorce. In addition, our Care Ministry comes alongside people daily in our community for support with meals and prayer when needed.

SPIRITUAL

We provide many steps for people to grow in their spiritual journeys at Gold Creek. From our introductory Discover Gold Creek luncheon, where people learn about the history of Gold Creek and where we're headed, to classes like Alpha where people ask questions and explore their faith, to making the decision to go public with their faith through baptism. Easter 2023 marked the highest number of baptisms in one day at Gold Creek, with over 75 across our three campuses!

HOPE CREEK

Hope Creek Charitable Foundation serves people with food insecurities in our community through the Mill Creek Community Food Bank and Backpacks of Hope programs. The Food Bank serves over 20,000 people each quarter, while the Backpacks program saw an overwhelming increase of 69% from the '22 to '23 school years: they now serve 555 students from 19 local schools every week. This program is so vital because it reaches into the lives of families to help sustain them over the weekends. Hope Creek is able to jump into action immediately whenever a need arises thanks to the support of Gold Creek.

s I think back to how Gold Creek Woodinville got its start nine years ago in a sewage treatment plant, I can't help but be so incredibly grateful for the grit of our people and the miracles God provided to get us where we are today.

In those nine years, we have moved from being a small church that fits into a moving truck to a big church that is now a landmark on a major highway. Between our preschool, our recovery programs and "driving to Costco" visibility, we have filled the kids' classrooms and the Worship Center on Sunday mornings. The greatest part of all these people coming to church is the stories we get to hear as the life change of Jesus happens. The baptism walls have been filled with names and countless people have said "yes" to God. One of the blessings and barriers we now have is that we have maxed out much of the space that we built just two years ago!

We now find ourselves in the position of needing to add more

space for our youth ministry. In the two years that we've been in the building, we have become very creative in how we use every inch of the church. But now we have an opportunity to make some muchneeded purchases to expand our space for growth while paying down our Semble LLC debt. This will allow us to do additional ministry, which the growth we've experienced requires.

Our plan to Forge the Future is creating more space and ministry at our campus for the spiritual growth of our families.




