IN THE CAR:

THANGING OUT:

Make this week's lesson real:

Pick some pumpkin seeds out of a pumpkin or buy a bag of seeds to snack on. How small are those seeds compared to the pumpkin, both in physical size and weight? Ask your kids what the parable of the seeds teaches them about faith.



AT DINNER:

Here are some great discussion starters:

- Trusting God more and more
- Have you ever seen God do something amazing that made you have more faith?
