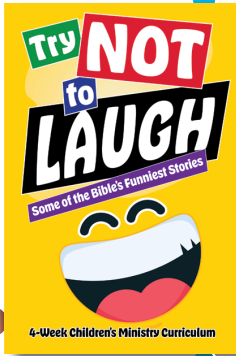

### THIS WEEK'S LESSON: KING SAUL'S OTHER THRONE



#### IN THE CAR:

Ask your child what they learned about this week on the drive home:

Saul needed a potty break in the middle of his manhunt for David. Little did he know that while he was relieving himself, David was right next to him - cutting off a piece of his robe. Saul's potty break shows us that when we do things God's way, even with our enemies, God will protect us as he did David. 1 Samuel 24, David Spares Saul on the Potty



#### HANGING OUT:

Make this week's lesson real:

Ask your kids how they think Saul felt when he heard David coming out of the cave. How was Saul doing the wrong thing, and how did David choose the right thing?



#### AT DINNER:

Here are some great discussion starters:

- What happened when Saul took a potty break?
- Why did David choose not to harm Saul?
- How can we prepare ourselves to resist peer pressure and do the right thing when no one else will do it with us?



#### AT BEDTIME:

Quiz your child on this week's memory verse:

What you need to know:
