## 5 Simple Ways You Can Make This Lesson Stick With Your Kids

### THIS WEEK'S LESSON:



#### IN THE CAR:

On the drive home, ask your child what he learned about this week's lesson: Today we learned about David and Jonathan, who were a perfect example of what best friends should be. David and Jonathan put their friendship first, and that's the kind of friend God wants us to be to others.



#### HANGING OUT:

Make this week's lesson real:
