Read Exodus 8

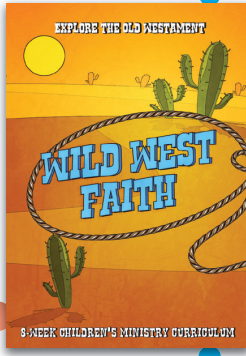
Answer these questions:

THIS WEEK'S LESSON: NEW SHERIFF IN TOWN



IN THE CAR:

Ask your child what they learned about this week on the drive home:

When lawlessness ran amok, a new sheriff would ride in to clean up the Wild West town. The Pharaoh of Egypt mistreated and abused the Israelites who lived there, so God sent in Moses and Aaron to set things right. But Pharaoh hardened his heart and would not acknowledge the awesome power of God. Exodus 8, The Plagues of Frogs, Gnats, and Flies



HANGING OUT:

Make this week's lesson real:

Take some time this week to clean up a room, a closet, or a part of your yard that is long overdue for a clean up job. As you do it, discuss with your kids why God wanted to "clean house" with Pharaoh, and ask them why they think Pharaoh was so stubborn to resist God's will.
