THIS WEEK'S LESSON: LAZARUS & THE GIRLS



IN THE CAR:

On the drive home, ask your child what he learned about this week's lesson: Today we learned that the one friend who will never fail us is Jesus. We read the story of Lazarus being raised from the dead, and we saw that Jesus always answers, always comforts, and can also give us new life..



HANGING OUT:

Make this week's lesson real: Share a time in your life when Jesus was there for you. Tell your child the circumstance when you needed him, and tell him how Jesus answered you. Let your child know that if they call on Jesus, he will respond to him as well. Be honest about the need to be still and listen through prayer and through God's Word. It's not always easy to hear those answers!



AT DINNER:

Here are some great discussion starters:

- Why didn't Jesus go to heal Lazarus right away?
- Do you think Mary and Martha had any idea Jesus could raise their brother to life?
- What is so special about the eternal life Jesus offers to us?



AT BEDTIME:

PARENT TIME:

Jesus is a friend who will never fail us. He was there for Lazarus and his sisters, and he's there for us.
