THIS WEEK'S LESSON: NEW LIFE



IN THE CAR:

Ask your child what they learned about this week on the drive home:

Jesus died on the cross for our sins. He was buried in a tomb, but he rose again! Jesus is alive. He is risen and wants to give us a new life with Him. John 19:28-20:18, Jesus' Death, Burial, and Resurrection



HANGING OUT:

Make this week's lesson real:

Ask your kids how eggs can represent new life, and then ask them how Jesus is able to give us new life because of Easter.



AT DINNER:
