THIS WEEK'S LESSON: DENIAL



IN THE CAR:

Ask your child what they learned about this week on the drive home:

Peter let Jesus down. He had promised to never turn his back on his Savior, but it was a promise he quickly broke. The good news is when we mess up, God is still there to catch us and can forgive our mistakes, just like He forgave Peter. Matthew 26:31-35, 69-75, Peter Disowns Jesus



HANGING OUT:

Make this week's lesson real:

Read the Easter story with your kids before next week. Ask them where Peter was during all of this, and ask them why Jesus forgave Peter after He was resurrected.



AT DINNER:

Here are some great discussion starters:

- Why did Peter deny knowing Jesus?
- How does it make you feel when you know you've messed up?
- How do we know Jesus will give us a second chance like He gave Peter?



AT BEDTIME:

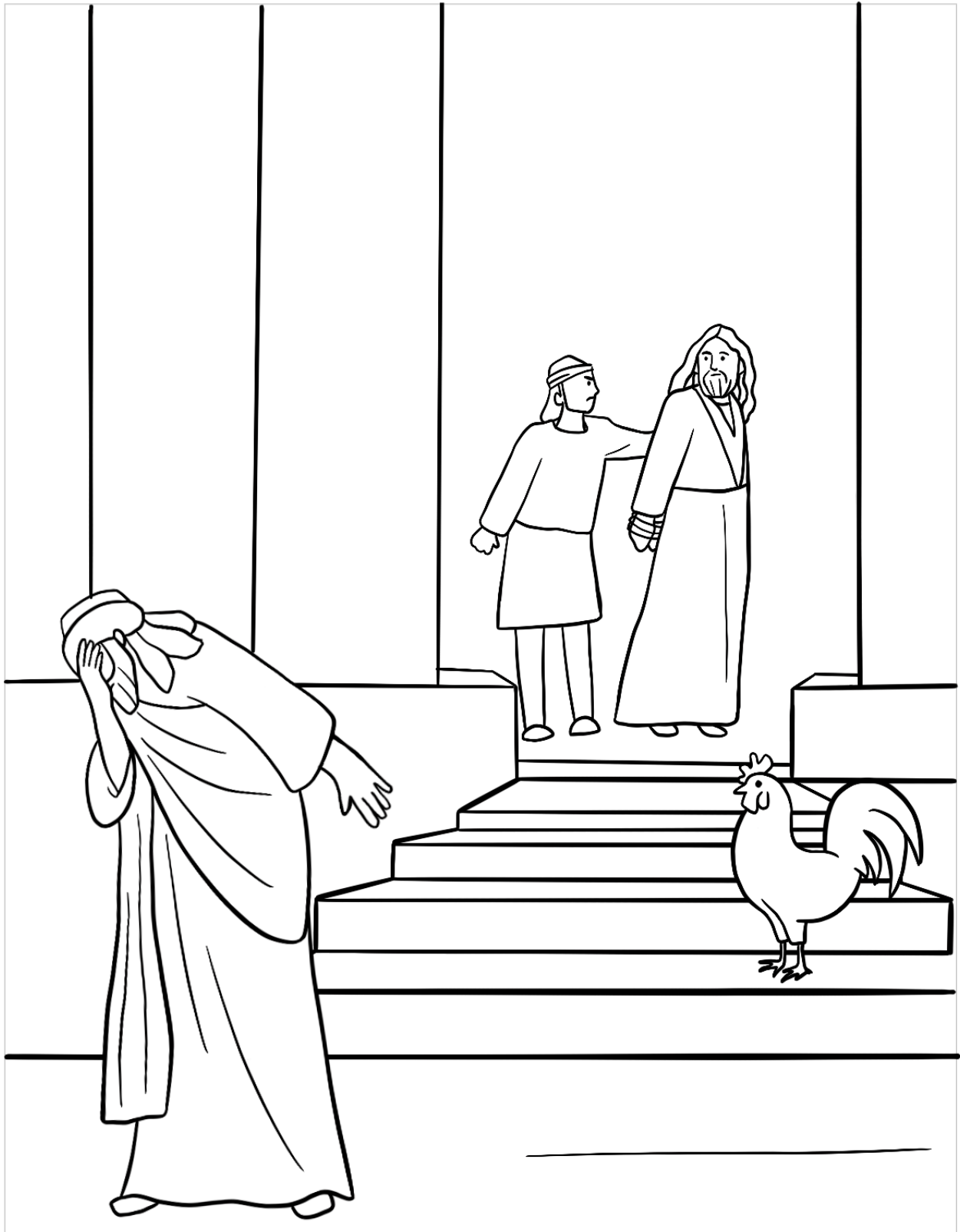
Quiz your child on this week's memory verse:
